Artificial Intelligence

IFPTE testifies at Congressional forum on Al

FPTE President Matt Biggs was the only labor representative speaking to a bipartisan Congressional forum on the potential impact of artificial intelligence (AI) on national and homeland security.

"It is IFPTE's view that any work performed by government employees that is deemed an 'inherently governmental function,' 'closely associated with inherently governmental functions' or subject to the national security exemption be completely protected from being replaced by AI by a private sector contractor," Biggs told the forum.

"This threshold is necessary," he continued, "to build and maintain AI expertise within the federal defense industrial base and is essential to the responsible development, innovation, implementation and procurement of AI for the public interest and for our national security."

The Dec. 6 forum was hosted by Senate Majority Leader **Chuck Schumer** (D-N.Y.) and Sens. **Martin Heinrich** (D-N.M.), **Mike Rounds** (R-S.D.) and **Todd Young** (R-Ind.) Biggs was one of 21 panelists invited to speak.

Biggs told the forum the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, "much to the dismay of IFPTE

and over our objections," is rushing ahead with a plan to use AI to replace human workers.



The Corps is "implementing remote

operations at our nation's hydroelectric dams and has plans to expand these operations to our navigational locks and dams," Biggs said. Instead of having humans on site to monitor dams and locks, operations would be centralized and performed remotely.

"This would not only result in the loss of good-paying, union-represented jobs, it would also put a huge target on these remote operations for a cyberattack, threatening communities located near these dams and businesses and supply chains that rely on our nation's inland waterways," Biggs said.

In the Northwest, IPFTE Local 8A represents civilian workers with the Army Corps of Engineers' Walla Walla District, Washington, and IFPTE Local 97 represents civilian workers at the Corps' district headquarters in Portland, Oregon.

About the Board

Executive Board members are responsible for setting and administering the annual budget and administering the affairs of SPEEA according to the constitution, bylaws and policies established by the membership and the union councils.

Reminder on federal laws

Ban on company/union resources – Federal law prohibits candidates from using union or company resources to conduct their election campaigns.

For example, do not:

- Use company (or union) resources such as paper, copy machines or email
- Campaign on company time
- Post on union or company bulletin boards

This applies to the candidates *and* their supporters.

Mailing campaign literature – Federal law also requires labor organizations to comply with all reasonable requests from any candidate to distribute campaign literature, at the candidate's expense, to members in good standing of the labor organization.

If candidates or their supporters want to send a mailing to members, they will work through a bonded mailing house. Addresses are never provided directly to a candidate.

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Aerospace supply chain

SPEEA's Rich Plunkett named to federal task force



R ich Plunkett, SPEEA's director of strategic development, has been named to a new federal task force studying the aerospace industry's supply chain.

The new Aerospace Supply Chain Resiliency (ASCR) Task Force will hold its

first meetings Jan. 10-11 in Washington, D.C. The group was authorized by Congress in 2023 and created by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT).

It is charged with identifying and assessing the availability of raw materials and critical manufactured goods, with respect to "major end items produced by the aerospace industry" per the DOT as well as the nation's airspace system infrastructure.

The Task Force also is assigned to identify best practices and make recommendations on ways

to mitigate risks and support a robust U.S. aerospace supply chain. It is expected to deliver its report to Congress in January 2025.

Plunkett said he looks forward to "working with the DOT and my colleagues on the ASCR Task Force to identify both current and future challenges with aerospace industry supply chains and ever evolving technologies and doing so from the perspective of workers in the industry."

Plunkett has been a SPEEA staff member since 1997. Prior, he spent 12 years at Boeing as an engineer for both commercial and defense programs.

SPEEA is one of three labor unions with representatives on the 16-member panel. The others are the International Association of Machinists (IAM), represented by General Vice President **Jody Bennett**, and the Transport Workers Union (TWU) represented by **Gary Peterson**, TWU's international vice president and air division director.

SPEEA sends support for Wichita nurses

The SPEEA Executive Board voted to send a letter of support to nurses fighting for fair contracts in Wichita.

The nurses are represented by the National Nurses Organizing Committee/National Nurses United (NNOC/NNU) at Via Christi facilities in Wichita and in Austin, Texas. They are seeking improved recruitment and retention to increase staffing levels for patient care.

strategy around helping individuals who are experiencing layoffs," said **Samuel Bradshaw**, the business solutions manager for WorkForce Central, the Pierce County agency that connects job seekers, employers and community organizations to help jobless people get the kind of training that local employers seek.

Mason-Placek has been a workforce development director with the Washington

State Labor Council (WSLC), AFL-CIO, since 2021. In that role, she seeks alternatives to plant closures and layoffs, and when they can't be avoided, she helps workers enroll in job retraining and re-employment programs offered through various federal and state programs.

She was SPEEA's legislative director from 2011 to 2019, then served in the same role for IAM District 751 before moving into her current position. Mason-Placek also is a labor representative on the Washington State Board of Community and Technical Colleges.

The Washington Workforce Association is a statewide organization comprised of local workforce development boards from around the state. The local boards coordinate the various federal state and local workforce development initiatives with a goal of identifying future job trends and training workers to fill them.
